KHBIF News

*<u>Special KHBIF Note</u>: Unless the KHBIF Affiliate rules change, show participants are required to participate in 3 RMHA sanctioned shows, <u>one of</u> <u>which must be an "A" show</u>. Currently there are two "A" shows: May 14th - the Sharon Copher Memorial and June 18th the Get Your Pink On Show. Also, please note, <u>the RMHA Inter-</u> <u>national will NOT count toward</u> <u>High Point Awards this year.</u> Therefore it will not count as an A show for KHBIF points either.

The Trail competition segment of the KHBIF award program will continue the same as in the past - horses may compete in as many competitions as desired but MUST compete in at least 3 to be qualified for KHBIF Trail awards. Only 3 competitions' points will count. They may be at shows or any obstacle competition with any organization - ETS, Southern Expo Trail Challenge, Equine Affaire Trail Challenge, NMHA, KMSHA, MPH (Old KY Saddler), RMHA, etc. Wendy Montgomery can pre-approve competitions if desired. It was with mixed emotions we bid farewell to Merry Go Blue in March. He was purchased by the Chad and Ann Hurley from Horseshoe Bend, ID. It is hard to see him move, but our boy is going where he can be turned out with his own herd of mares in a pasture all his own on a full time basis. We are glad for him to be in this good situation even though he will be greatly missed.

Increased Costs

Over the last year and a half, farm expenses have continued to rise. Grain has gone up 50% and Charlie has been told that hay will increased anywhere from \$.50 to a \$1.00 per bale. Horse grooming products and supplies have also gone way up in price. Even though the president has increased release of domestic oil, costs for diesel are at an all-time high. Unfortunately, some of these increases are going need to be shared with our clients. Invoices that go out May 1st will include higher prices on most services. Since we have good pasture, board will be able to remain the same, but training will need to increase to \$750 per month. Because of fuel costs, transportation to shows beyond 50 miles will increase to \$.60 per mile traveled. For local shows (less than 50 miles) the charge will be a flat fee of \$75. As in the past, transportation charges will include show prep. We will do all we can to keep expenses down. We appreciate you. Thank you all for your support and understanding.

Memberships

If you have not checked on your association memberships, it is that time of year again. There is a revolving membership. They are due a year from when you joined initially. Rider cards are also due. The easiest way to renew is to go to rmhorse2.com and renew through the membership portal. Please email me a copy of your cards so I will have them come show time. Thanks!

RMHA News

As costs for everything continues to increase, the RMHA has made a few changes to the way they do business. If you plan to pay with a credit card, there will be a 4% fee charged in addition to the service for which you are paying. By paying with check, you can avoid this fee. In addition, the office staff is trying to encourage complete applications for foal registrations, transfers, and certifications. If the required documents are incomplete when sent to the office and they need to call you for clarification, there is now a \$10 Courtesy Fee that will be charged. The office does not retain a list of credit cards so if you plan to pay by card, you will need to send your credit number on either a sticky note or on the documents you are sending in order to avoid extra charges. As frustrating as it is to see costs go up, these charges will help keep membership costs from increasing. Increases are avoidable if you send a check and fill out forms correctly. If we can help in any way, we'll be glad to do so.

Judges Clinic

The RMHA Judge's Clinic that was scheduled in March was postponed due to inclement weather. It will be rescheduled for a later date. No specific time has been set but they are considering a two day clinic that would provide more learning opportunities for Judges and auditors.
