RMHA International Championship Show September 4 - 7



Every August, it is surprising that the summer has been with us long enough that suddenly the shows are winding down and the International isn't far away. There are a few more shows but Charlie is planning to forgo those in fa-



vor of going to the Southeast Summer Championships in White Pine, TN. There will be two "A" Rocky Mountain Shows - one on Saturday 8/17 and one on Sunday, 8/18. There are lots of classes including Paso Finos and Open Gaited classes in addition to the Rocky classes. It is really helpful when there are multibreed shows which space out our classes. The show is in a climate controlled arena. There is also an auxiliary warm-up area and stalls behind the arena. We used to show there years ago with UMH. I looked

at the RMHA website again today and the show bill isn't posted yet but we have a copy. It should be posted soon (or we can email you a copy). It is several pages long or I would have posted it here. Some information you will need is about the Host Hotel. We have reservations at the Best Western Plus Morristown Conference Center Hotel (423-587-2400) in Morristown, TN for \$99 a night plus tax. Be sure to ask for the "horse show rate" when you call. There is a Hampton Inn near by that is a little newer but the rates are \$70 a night more. We will leave early Friday, the 16th, show on Saturday and Sunday, and then leave when the show is over. Charlie and Julie T. will pull trailers. There will also be a car going - for Leah, Lyngle and anyone else who wants to come. Stalls are \$80 each for the weekend which includes bedding. Stalls will not be billed until September 1 since we





don't have to pay anything in advance. We hope lots of folks will be able to join us in TN. It will be a fun time and we'll make lots of good memories.

The RMHA International. is getting close! The 2024 theme is "Rockin' the Runway". It will be the 36th annual RMH International Grand Championship Horse Show. Move in day is Tuesday, Sept. 3rd which follows Labor Day. The show itself begins Wednesday, Sept. 4th and will run through Saturday, September 7th. Stalls were made available to order on-line July 24th. The process went smoothly. We simply paid for the number of stalls we needed and requested where we would like to be located. Seniority over the last few years will help us get in our usual barns. There was also an option to request being near friends. It should be ok. We are supposed to hear soon after August 5th what the exact stall locations are.

There is still quite a bit to do. We will send in **pre-entries** by the end of August. More information should be available in a couple of weeks after the RMHA Board meeting.

As we have been doing for our regular shows, we will collect checks made out to the RMHA when you get to the International. We can help close out your account on Saturday night, too. Copies of your checks will be sent by the first of the week. Watch for more information soon.
