Every August, we are surprised that summer is moving so swiftly toward fall. Even so, there are many more fun times ahead.

Charlie's plan is to go to the Southeast Summer Cham-



pionships in White Pine, TN again this year. At White Pine there will be an "A" RMHA show on Saturday and a "B" show on Sunday. There are lots of classes including Paso Finos and Open Gaited in addition to the Rocky classes. It is really helpful when there are multi-breed shows which space out our classes. The show is in a climate controlled arena. There is a warm-up area with stalls located down from there. We have gone several years and have had a great time. It really prepares the horses for the International to be inside. The show bill is attached. The arena address is Great Smoky Mountain Expo



Center, 1615 Pavilion Dr., White Pine, TN 37890. Some information you will need is about the Host Hotel. We have reservations at the Best Western Plus Morristown Conference Center Hotel (423-587-2400) in Morristown, TN for \$99 a night plus tax. Be sure to ask for the "horse show rate" when you call. There is a Hampton Inn near by that is a little newer but the rates are a little more. Text Lyngle if you need that info. We will leave early Friday, the 14th, show on Saturday and Sunday, and then go home when the show finishes up. Charlie and Julie will pull trailers. I will probably drive separately. We'll take some food with us. The concession stand doesn't have much variety. Stalls are \$85 per horse (including 2 bags of bedding) for the weekend. We will split the cost of a tack stall. Stalls will not be billed until September 1st since we don't have to pay anything in advance. Entries will be emailed before the 7th. We hope lots of folks will be able to join us in TN. It will be a fun time and we'll make lots of good memories with our friends and horses.

The RMHA International is getting closer! Stalls have been requested. Thanks to those who have sent sponsorships! The 2026 theme is "Celebrating the Year of the Horse - A Legacy in Motion". It will be the 38th annual RMH International Grand Championship Horse Show. We have a frame and several backdrops to choose

from. There are stall fronts, banners, and ferns as well. If you have your own stall fronts or signs we'll be glad to use those.

Move in day is Tuesday, Sept. 1st. Stalls are usually ready around noon. Charlie and Olivia will work horses that evening in the arena. Ruby will not be there until Friday because of school. If you plan to practice at the KHP, let Charlie know what time is best for him to help. The show itself begins Wednesday, Sept. 2nd and will run through Saturday. Stalls were made available to order on -line in July. The process went smoothly. We simply paid for the number of stalls we needed and requested where we would like to be located. Seniority over the last four years will help us get in our usual barns again (we hope). We will hear sometime in August where the exact location is going to be.

There is still quite a bit to do. We will send pre-entries in by mid-August. The portal is ready now. The on-line entry process worked well for us last couple of years. Charlie will be working with everyone to make sure your horses are entered correctly. There are also special awards for the horses, youth, amateur, and adult riders. We'll get everyone entered in those too. As we have been doing for our regular shows, we will collect checks made out to the RMHA when you get to the International. We can help close out your account on Saturday night, too, if you want. Watch for more information soon. We will update as info comes out. We will have a great time.

won the blue on WOF in western, M/G CTP, and the CTP



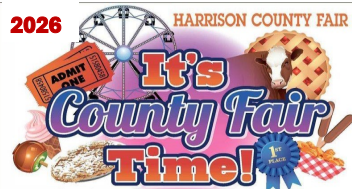
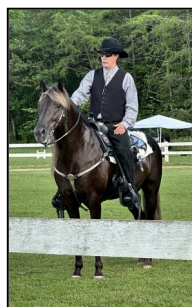
Championship. Likewise she won the blue with Slamma Jamma in M/G Trail and in the Trail Championship. She

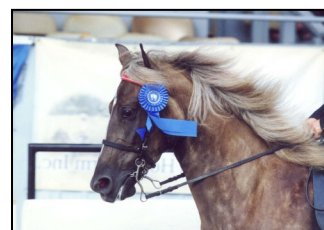
