

First, I want to thank everyone for a great year last year both in and out of the show ring. As we start to look forward to the 2023 show season, there will be a small change. This year we will be planning to attend two shows each month prior to the RMHA International rather than trying to hit them all. This will allow our horses and riders to get in the ring and stay fit without overtaxing horses/crew. Hopefully, this will also allow a little more family time between shows and allow folks to schedule other activities such as trail rides, clinics, camping trips, etc. I really appreciate everyone's understanding and support in this decision.

Something else new that I have been working on is hosting a series of

clinics focusing specifically on helping people with pacing horses. It will be a progressive series with three parts spread over a few months with the same group fence and use it as a belt. of horses/riders. The idea would be that I would work with participants and their horse while giving them exercises and "homework" so to speak to work on between clinics. Applicants will be asked to submit a video and will be selected in order to ensure the horse really is a pacey and that this clinic is a good fit for them.
