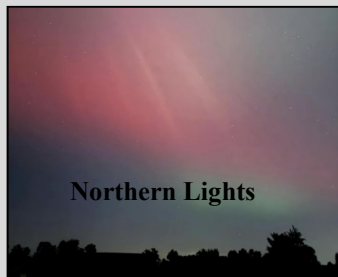
this summer. They had great FFA banquets and have served their respective schools well. They are all ready for summer!
